Council Tax increases

Dear All

As many of you will be aware the council tax bills shows the Parish Council portion increasing by 4%, we would like to explain how this is the case. The National Government changed the way it funds Council Tax payments for those household that receives benefits, in the past it has directly funded this to District councils, however this has changed and now grants are being allocated and these are not included in the District Councils percentage calculation. Our real terms increase was 2% and full details can be found at www,braunstonpc.org (click on Parish Council and then Finance)This is the first increase since April 2010 and we have managed to keep increases to zero despite costs like street lighting electricity rising by 42% in the same period. Often it is a wonderful privilege and joy but sometimes it is tough and exhausting and I occasionally wonder what on earth I'm doing! (I expect you do sometimes too!) A couple of nights ago, tending slightly towards this frame of mind, I had a dream. Not in a Martin Luther King kind of way - more an "I'm- tired- and- I- saw- the- Jehovah's- Witnesses- around- Braunston- cost-of- state- funeral- mental- stew kind of way! In my dream two smartly dressed young men (see what I mean?) came to my office and offered me £10 million to give up my ministry. They opened a case and showed me the money and said that if I agreed to stop serving God they would leave it with me. £10 million!! How many church roofs could I fix with that and still have a cosy retirement!!?

But in my dream I sent them away sharpish with their money and when I woke up I knew exactly why. Although there sometimes are the black and weary times when I wonder if I am on a fools errand there are also the joyful, bubbling, energy-filled times when I know that I am not and when the only thing to do is dance and sing and share the excitement of the gospel. If this Jesus, on whom I stake my life, exists and if everything I talk about is true then I can laugh and cry. I laugh because of what he has done for us and for what he gives us. I cry because of what they did to him. Because of what they still do to him; Because of what I do to him. Because I don't always understand. Because I feel his pain and his unquenchable love for lives and hearts and minds and bodies that are broken and lost. My mind may lose its way sometimes but my heart believes.

And he gave me a job to do. And eventually I may hear him say - "Well Sarah, you made a bit of a mess of it sometimes but you kept trying. I finished my job and now you've finished yours. Come and join me."

I think that is worth £10 million. Every blessing




" Two important dates FOR your diaries!



Information from Braunston Parish Council Village questionnaire

We are continuing to collate and analyse the results from the questionnaire



The overwhelming majority of respondents were either quite positive or very positive about living in Braunston.

The things that people like about living in Braunston are being part of a friendly, rural community that is quiet and peaceful with no traffic noise, but within easy access to motorways. People praised:

" The excellent variety of shops including the post office, and the many clubs and organisations in the village.

- " The local school and pre-school.
- " The canals, marina and many good walks across open countryside.
- " The choice of Public Houses and eating places.
- " The Church floodlit in the evening and hearing the bells ringing.
- " The Braunston Village News for providing notification of local events and services.

" Events including boat shows, The Village Show and Village Festival amongst others.

When it comes to suggesting improvements the number one complaint in a large majority of responses to the questionnaire is dog fouling and owners failing to clear up after their pets. Negotiating pavements and footpaths while attempting to stop toddlers and pushchairs from becoming contaminated causes many concern. There have been requests for more dog poo and litter bins to be provided.

The next most common issues are traffic and highways related including:

" The blind corners at the approaches to the village and speeding on the High Street and Church Road especially during school run times.

" Car parking on the High Street, around The Green and in the vicinity of the school. Cars parking on the pavements impeding pedestrians and pushchairs and wheelchair users.

" There are suggestions for upgrading road surfaces including Harrow Lane and opposite the school in Barby Lane.

" It was felt that narrow footpaths and uneven surfaces make them treacherous in inclement weather. Improved gritting to roads and footpaths was requested;

" A zebra crossing at the end of Church Road to help those walking to school;

" A cycleway to Daventry and bus stops outside the shops;

Other improvements suggested were:

- " Mains gas supply;
- " Low cost housing:
- " More facilities/activities for older children;
- " A market for local produce;
- " The Braunston Festival to be an annual event;
- " Faster broadband speed.

It was felt that the towpath towards the tunnel could be improved, water supplied to the cemetery, more trees could be planted and that the green field separation from Daventry should be maintained.

All of these issues and other results of the questionnaire will be considered by the Parish Council when looking at a possible neighbourhood plan and when making other decisions.

More detailed information about the questionnaire will be provided at the Annual Parish Meeting on Tuesday May 21st at 7.30 in the Village Hall.

If your dog fouls in a public place and you do not clean it up you will be breaking a Dog Control Order under the Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005. If an authorised officer witnesses you not cleaning up after your dog, you may be given a fixed penalty of £75. If you refuse to pay the fixed penalty you may be taken to court and be fined up to £1000 plus court costs.

The neighbourhood surveys recently sent out by the Parish Council showed that dog fouling is one of the biggest environmental concerns people have about living in Braunston. The overwhelming majority of people find dog waste unacceptable. If you witness someone letting their dog foul without cleaning it up afterwards in a public place, you should report this to the dog warden on 01327 302277 with as much information as possible.

I went to give a talk to local sixth form students about being a Councillor this week.

To be frank, I was terrified.

Inevitably, I over-prepared... I had reams of notes on Margaret Thatcher's legacy (I was a sixth-form student when she resigned), on youth unemployment, on women in politics.

In the end we had a very informal and relaxed conversation about bus subsidies, town centre shops and the lack of facilities for young people. But my preparations really made me really think about why I decided to stand for election as a District Councillor, a year ago.

The students' teacher introduced me as a local politician. This threw me. It's actually the last thing I feel I am.

My political beliefs are very important to me. But on a day-to-day basis they hardly figure. Councillors are public servants, elected to serve not just some of you, but all of you. I stood for election as a District Councillor because I wanted to do something for the people and places where I live. It was as simple as that.

Politics hardly come into an anti-dog fouling campaign, community transport projects, dealing with parking obstructions or litter-picking. Even when it comes to campaigning to get a bus service that meets our needs, representing those affected by welfare reform, protecting our canal heritage and our open countryside, supporting our local businesses - for all this, what you need most of all is a committed local champion, not a local politician.

I'd like to thank everyone who has supported and encouraged me over my first year as District Councillor.



BRAUNSTON WALKERS

Walk Saturday 20/04/2013 - Harlestone Firs (c.10.4 miles) This really is a magnificent walk around Althorp House and takes in the little known, Upper Harlestone, a perfect old stone village that does a fair impression of The Slaughters in The Cotswolds but is only ten miles away from home. We had unbroken sunshine, a real Spring day, as sixteen of us set off into the woodland at Harlestone Firs. We left the shady woodland, crossed a field and emerged on the busy A428. After walking down through the lovely old stone village our path took us left off the main road and soon became a footpath through parkland and then we turned left by a ford over the rushing river and up to a stone balustrade by a fantastic lake. A great spot for a pause to suck Nigel and Judith's sherbet lemons and bask in the spring sunshine. The path then takes us back to Harlestone church before crossing a golf course. It continues past the ornate village hall and past Upper Harlestone, a beautiful stone village, before we joined the Midshire Way, a portion of the 225 mile which stretches from Buckinghamshire through Northants, Leicestershire, Nottinghamshire, across Derbyshire and up to Greater Manchester. It also is labelled up as the Northamptonshire Round a 51 mile circuit both too far for today but we will save them for another day. We walked over fields around Nobottle Wood with its carpet of white Anenomes. Eventually this path leads over a cultivated lawn by a cottage to emerge on the road for 25 yards or so before taking a field path over muddy fields and down into Little Brington and The Saracens Head. An award winning food pub and I could see why as we tucked into baguettes and pints of foaming IPA beer. A real slick operation and, of course, highly recommended!! All too soon we had to put our boots on and set off again out of Little Brington on a tree lined track which leads to Althorp House. After about 34 of a mile we turned left on a field path over ridge and furrow fields with fantastic views of the side of Althorp House over the fields, to reach Great Brington. The path then turns sharp right and leads out of the village over fields and into the woodland of Chinkwell Spinney. The track reaches a small B road which runs around the magnificent parkland at Althorp. We followed the road alongside the house and grounds past a family having a picnic on the verge where the wall around the estate is low enough to give a view of the old house. We had to climb up a hill to reach a T junction where the spinney is called Chinkwell Clumps. On the map it shows several features in the parkland called Garden Stew, Great Stew and Oaktree Stew and also Dog Pond. We would have loved to see them but the park was not open so we continued down into Upper Harlestone past some really picturesque thatched cottages before turning left over fields to reach the road and then taking a field path right through the forest at Round Oak plantation and back to the cars and home for a cuppa! Our next walks are as follows:

18th May Braunston! (c.10 miles)29th, June Strines Moor (c.11 miles) As both are a fair distance away we will meet at 08.00 at the village hall.
