Moral signposts and Peeing up a wall.

One of the charges often levelled at the Church is that it takes a moral high ground that it does not deserve. Blooming hypocrites! But what is morality anyway? The world says that we should all do what we believe to be right and not be forced to accept anyone else's views.

Yet another charge against the Church is that it does not give a strong moral lead. I wouldn't argue with that. Often as a vicar my life would be a lot easier if policy decisions were clearly communicated - but it is easy to see why. We all want a strong moral lead until it conflicts with what we like to do! So here are some questions for you. These are all things that happened to me and a friend in the last few weeks.

What do you do if you are out and about in Daventry and you see a young man peeing against a shop front in Daventry bold as you like? Do you say something? If you do you risk being sprayed with abuse (or worse). If you do not you condone the anti social behaviour.

What do you do if you see a memorial service in a park being invaded by three drunken lads who take down their pants and parade their spotty bums past the mourners? Do you say something and take the abuse? Risk being dubbed a hypocritical killjoy with no sense of humour? Or let it go as harmless

What do you do if someone in your family is behaving appallingly towards somebody else? Do you say something and risk accusations of disloyalty to your own? or point it out?

What do you do when your grandchild's funeral turns into a battleground between his divorced parents? Do you say something? Do you stand by watching the child's dignity shredded by two people who cannot come together for one day for the sake of their own child? Or do you risk being set upon by one or both parties for suggesting that they are getting it very wrong? Or do you wring your hands and lament the situation?

What do you do when you realise that pornographic images on mobile phones and memory sticks are common currency among children as young as twelve? Do you say something? Do you risk alienating your child on an issue that may affect their relationships for the rest of their lives? Or do you just say that "boys will be boys"?

So should we challenge the behaviour of others and on what grounds?? What the church should do is stand for the gospel and the Kingdom of God - a society in which a moral standard of God prevails. It is the job of the Church to put up signposts for society over big ethical issues pointing out God's way. Individuals will respond as they see fit but we will never be surprised when the response is a self righteous stream of urine up the post!

A firm hand at the helm - for 35 years.

Janet McCarthy has decided to step down from her commitment and service to the village of Braunston after over a quarter of a century. What does one say next? Thanks. And thanks again. And good wishes for the future.

She has served for 35 years on the Parish Council and has been chairman for 23 of those years. That would be a great enough undertaking in itself but she has also represented the village on Daventry District Council since 1989. The combination of these two elected offices provided a strong platform from which to work in an effective and constructive way. Her time, effort and determination have always been at the disposal of all who live in Braunston.

All have benefited from a constant alertness to what has needed to be done. And there has been a vision, an attention to detail and a knowledge of how to get things done. Many have a special and individual intervention to thank her for. Those who have worked with her on the two councils can speak of unfailing courtesy, independent thinking and reliable fairness. We have responded to her skill and sure touch as chairman and leader.

Janet may object to me stealing a title from a famous play by Bertolt Brecht entitled 'Mother Courage' but she would smile at the reference. Certainly it must have taken great effort, determination and character to continue over the years in the face of, sometimes, ferocious opposition, sometimes, mind-numbing apathy. But whenever a vacancy has occurred on the Parish Council with no volunteer for nomination she has made it her duty to hunt out and persuade someone to come forward. The present parish council represents all areas of the village, all ages, all social groups, all political views and many of the volunteer activities. Our genuinely independent council embodies Janet's vision of good governance - for this is what she surely values above all.

Her last official event will be to chair the Annual Parish Meeting at 8.15pm on Monday 21st May. Many villagers will want to attend this meeting in recognition of what has been achieved. Prior to the Annual Parish Meeting the newly elected Parish Council will hold their first meeting to elect the next chairperson and members of sub committees. A new time begins: may it be as successful as the last.

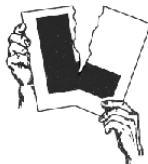

Sheila Beckett

Never a day seems to go by without another circular landing on the door step or article on the news, imploring us to do more to save the planet and recycle our waste, be it plastic's, glass, compost and now food waste. This craze however is nothing new and anyone of a certain age will recall recycling was just known as make do and mend. Contrary to popular belief Kirsty Alsop has not invented this, Sheila Beckett of Braunston is living proof that recycling doesn't stop at the Brown Bin.

Sheila is well known to many residents and boaters in Braunston and not many people would have missed her adverts in the village shop inviting people to take part in anything from Hedgerow foraging to paper making. I met her recently to discover more about her lifestyle and ethos.

Sheila bought the old Champion Pub (long since defunct since the 1800's) after a family member moved out, and she couldn't face the cottage moving out of the Nurser family. Her Great Grandfather was William Nurser and her Grandfrather, Walter Nurser. Her links with that family could fill a small book in itself.

Since childhood, as with many 'war babies', Sheila has continued to practice what she preaches, in her words carrying on the culture of Make do and Mend. Her fondest memories go back to the May Day school celebrations wearing a dress made by an Aunt from off cuts. To this day she believes in the principal of the Chia theory, which in a nut shell believes that the earth is always trying to regulate itself and that mankind is doing its best to upset things. By following the recycling principal and her other passion, Yoga, mankind can try to redress the balance.

Shelia runs classes covering everything from making paper and candles, using pulped shredded paper and used candle wax to mosaics using broken china and glass. In addition she encourages people to gather natural ingredients from the local Hedgerow, undertaking guided walks in season, and makes Jams and preserves from the fruits. She also makes and teaches people to use plants and flowers to produce natural remedies for conditions such as Arthritis and skin ailments. There is nothing that Sheila won't re-use and she isn't adverse to picking up scraps of material from paths be it glass, metal or anything that she can re-use. She states that you don't have to go to Hobby Craft or buy a kit to create something. In essence give it a go and surprise yourself.

The council and Sheila don't always agree on the rights and wrongs of recycling in the county. She was a staunch supporter of the tip shop when it was at the tip, but believes since its demise most of what ends up in the skips themselves ends in landfill. She hopes by encouraging others through crafts she can do something to help. Give it a go!

BRAUNSTON WALKERS

Walk Saturday 21/04/2012

Chipping Warden (c.8.53 miles)

This walk takes in the beautiful rolling country all around Chipping Warden north of Banbury. The weather forecast showed heavy showers just about anywhere so we were not hopeful as 13 of us set out to drive to the Trafford Bridge, a famous site of the English civil war. We were far more peaceful as we donned our boots and took a footpath off to the right for a delightful walk alongside the babbling River Cherwell in brilliant sunshine. Just opposite Culworth Mill we crossed the river and continued to follow the path past Mire Spinney and the Wadground Barn and continuing alongside the river to reach a B road which runs into Culworth. It was still sunny as we reached the village when we turned right onto a disused railway track. Another great path although not strictly a footpath it leads us to reach an old railway bridge under which our footpath set off in Westerly direction to hit the first of many long steep 160 metre hills. Fortunately we brought Terry along and paused to catch breath while he handed out boiled sweets. The rest and the sweets were truly welcome.

We dropped steeply downhill with fantastic views all round but no sooner had we caught our breath when there was yet another steep hill to negotiate and, just like a roller coaster there was a third hill after that leading up across Danes Moor to reach Edgecote Lodge Farm which takes full advantage of its high position overlooking fantastic rolling fields. We dropped downhill away from the farm house and after several fields we came to a fence enclosing a long strip of land used to exercise race horses. Being a lot less fit than race horses we ducked under the fence, crossed a field and reached a B road where we turned left along the road that passes Edgecote Church where there are prominent graves of the Courage family of brewers that once owned the magnificent Edgecote House next to the church. It was just spitting with rain as the path goes left, crosses the River Cherwell and reaches our lunch stop in the lovely old stone village of Chipping Warden. Just before the village we came across a small stone obelisk put up to commemorate a Wellington bomber that crashed here in April 1945 and the five crew members who tragically died on a training sortie when their aircraft had an engine problem and crashed just short of the airfield. The oldest was 24 and the youngest who survived, was only 19.

We reached the old stone, Griffin Inn and ordered our pints of Pedigree before tucking into delicious baguettes and great chips (I was very good and didn't have any but the others said they were excellent) It was sunny again as we pulled on our gear and set off along the road to reach a path over a football field, not currently in use, over another field and into a small wood called Calves Close Spinney. This wood is full of world war 2 bunkers although many are now overgrown with trees and bushes. Our path emerged from the strange little wood and dropped down to eventually reach a road. We crossed the road and our path set off steeply uphill which was a bit of a shock after lunch!! This is called Job's hill and it was job I can tell you. At the top we branched off the path right passing Wardenhill Farm and then dropping downhill before turning right and making our way over fields to reach Trafford House. On the way the rain started in earnest but we donned wet gear and sheltered for a few minutes when it stopped and the sun shone as we crossed fields back to the cars and home for a cuppa!! As we reached the cars the next heavy shower arrived but we didn't care as we were in the dry. An excellent walk and we were very lucky with the weather.

Why not come and join us on our future walks normally meeting at 10 at the village hall on the third Saturday in the month:

19th May The Malvern Hills (c.11 miles)

16th June Ellastone and the River Dove (c.11 m)
