Important information from Braunston Parish Council Neighbourhood Survey

Neighbourhood Planning, recently introduced by the Government as part of the Localism Act, is a new way for communities to influence the future of the places where they live and work. In order to take on the responsibility of Neighbourhood Planning the Parish Council will need to gather information about the parish, its population, housing and the services and employment located in it. We also want to find out the views parishioners have on issues affecting life here.

In order to do this we are presently compiling a questionnaire which will be sent to all households later in the year and will give everyone the opportunity to contribute evidence and opinions to be considered in the planning process. We need to hear your views on what you believe the most important challenges and opportunities affecting the future of our community are in order to ensure our interests and needs are fully considered as part of the Braunston Neighbourhood Plan to be submitted to Daventry District Council in due course. Please look out for the questionnaire which will be delivered to your home. We hope all households will contribute so that we can show that our Neighbourhood Plan is based on the opinions of all parts of our community. Coming clean and going straight

I bet there isn't an adult in this village who was not brought up with the knowledge that if you do something naughty, make a mistake or break something the best thing to do is own up. I also bet that, despite knowing this, most of us have at some stage tried to lie our way out of something only then to have the sky fall on our head twice. Once for the original crime and then again for the deceit. I myself at the innocent age of 8 was ejected from the Brownies when it was discovered that not only had I peed into a lemonade bottle and tried to convince someone to drink it but that I had then subsequently tried to escape detection by heavily implying that someone else had done it. You couldn't get away with it these days with all the advances in genetic fingerprinting. I expect the Brownies even have a DNA testers badge. Mind you, even in the absence of 21st century science I didn't get away with it then either. (This may or may not be what you want to read about the vicar but let's face it; it doesn't half prove that God can somehow salvage a purse out of a sow's ear. You might even call it redemption.) So I know from personal experience that coming clean, sincerely apologising and offering to make good is the best way forward when we get into trouble through negligence, through weakness or through our own deliberate fault. Not only is this sensible but it is rooted in Christian moral values. If you are truly sorry for what you have done then you ask God for forgiveness which will be granted because He loves you even though you are frequently appalling. And then you can move on. Yes. Coming clean is definitely the right thing to do and even if God has never really figured in your life it works well with those in authority. Admit your guilt and you will be praised for owning up and the punishment will be lenient. That was my experience until this week when I discovered that these merciful and humane concepts have completely bypassed the people who are given power over the lives of others within the local benefits system. Be afraid. Be very afraid.

A member of our community had made a mistake over benefits claims over a period of months and was mortified to have done so. He went to confess, admitted the error down to the last penny and offered to pay back what he owed. He was kindly received but told that there would be further investigation. There was and I went along too for moral support. Had I not been there I would not have believed the way he was treated.

The interview was recorded under police caution. The process was clearly more important than the truth. The interviewers were appalling; ill prepared, nasty and plainly eager to catch him out. There was no opportunity for him to explain. Every question was aggressive and the interviewers showed no mercy, no acknowledgement that had he not come clean they might never have found the error and no acknowledgement that he had actually volunteered to pay back and take the rap. It became clear that coming clean in this instance was a big mistake. Not morally of course. But these people are not interested in morality. Process comes over truth. Mercy is irrelevant to the process. Respect for fellow humans is absent. The due process may be followed but the only justice will be God's and that could be a long time coming.

I'm going to look into this because respect for every human being is a fundamental characteristic of the God I believe in and the society I want to live in and lack of respect is institutional evil. And because coming clean and going straight should always be the right thing to do. So if you have had similar experiences please contact me confidentially. Things do not have to be like this. And if reason will not prevail then it might be first stop, the Brownies. With an order for three dozen bottles of lemonade for the works and pensions canteen.



Halfway through August I received two photographs and a letter from Major Smith, the commanding officer of "D" Squadron, King's Royal Hussars, the current recipients of our parcels. I do hope that many of you have already seen the photograph as it is on display in our village shop. However, through the auspices of the BVN, I thought that everyone should have the opportunity to read Major Smith's accompanying letter.

"To Mrs Worrall and the generous families of Braunston Village,

Today was a landmark occasion in Forward Operating Base Price - we opened the 1070th parcel from your village shop! From all the officers and soldiers in the Warthog Squadron I pass on a heartfelt thank you for your unrelenting generosity. I can guarantee that your acts of kindness provide great comfort during our deployment out here in Afghanistan. The sense of appreciation you have generated goes well beyond the physical gifts themselves. It is the gesture of genuine support of our work and endeavours, whilst we are far from home and toiling in the heat, which adds hugely to morale. As a mark of our gratitude we organised a Squadron photo, enclosed, to prove we exist and are very thankful for your support.

The Squadron is now just under halfway through our 6 ½ month tour. Half of the Squadron have just returned from a two week rest and recuperation period. The remainder depart tomorrow for their mid tour break. The process of returning home is a marathon in itself, with a helicopter ride to Camp Bastion. We then wait 24 hrs before flying to Brize Norton in Oxfordshire via U.A.E and Cyprus. The delays in Heathrow have nothing on the military system!

I hugely enjoyed flicking through the Braunston Village News which was enclosed in the parcels. I was delighted to see that community spirit and village life in Braunston is overflowing. One of the many reasons some of us, probably naively, remain in the Army is to preserve the village community way of life. Please never give up the little quirks, traditions, hobbies and activities which mark us out as distinctly British!

Thank you all once again for your continued support and generosity. We wish you all a very enjoyable and pleasant summer. Julian Smith"

The number of parcels sent out to our troops since April 2007 now stands at 1093 and I thank everyone who contributes to "the box". Receiving such mail really does make our efforts so worthwhile.



BRAUNSTON WALKERS

Walk Saturday 18/8/2012 - Around Wormleighton (c.10.6 miles)

It promised to be the hottest day of the year and with no rain forecasted we were optimistic although I was a little concerned about some of the hills we would have had to navigate. Sixteen of us set off from the car park at The Wharf Inn in Fenny Compton along the Oxford Canal tow path. The pretty, narrow and meandering canal built by engineer James Brindley follows the contours to avoid much earth removal, as do most of the 365 miles of canal that he built. We decided against doing the full 365 miles and after a false start at the second bridge since the pub we walked along the towpath to the correct bridge, crossed the canal and walked up a field with lots of humps and bumps. This is the medieval village of Wormleighton and we emerged on a small lane leading up to the tiny but beautiful old village. St Peters church here has a wooden rood screen from about 1600 that was taken from Southam church and amongst the old carvings are one of the earliest spectacle wearers and one of a man sticking out his tongue. Is that why they call it a rood screen?

We came out of the cool, shady old church into blazing sunshine and followed the track to a magnificent stone arch by the old Wormleighton Manor. This was owned by the same Spencer family who are now based at Althorp and the building started in 1516. But even he, at the time richer than anyone in the kingdom except for King James, had to get royal permission to castellate the building. There are family connections to the Knightleys of Fawsley and even to the Washington family of nearby Sulgrave and to Winston Churchill. It is a fascinating old brick built (apparently Spencer was a dedicated follower of fashion) rather than the beautiful old mellow honey coloured local stone. Elizabeth 1st stayed in the house in 1572. Following the decision of the land owners to get rid of all the people in preference for the much more profitable sheep in 1498 an inquest jury recorded that 60 villagers had been evicted from the Wormleighton Estate "weeping, to wander in idleness ... perished of hunger" I began to know how they felt as we approached our lunch stop at the Wharf Inn Fenny Compton.

Our path lead us out of the village by the old arch and over several fields of wheat, some recently harvested, past the site of the medieval village of Stoneton and the moat around Stanton Manor. We paused to admire the far reaching views from here and to suck on Brian's sweets then dropped down the field, over the canal bridge, across a field where red kites soared overhead and then over another canal bridge as the canal winds its way along the contours. The path follows the bend in the canal before striking off steeply uphill over a recently ploughed field. This was a real test of stamina but the group were all gold medallists as far as I am concerned and made it to the top with a minimum of grumbles. The path then leads back into Wormleighton and on to a T junction where we turned right and then followed the road for about a mile before dropping onto the canal tow path to reach the pub. The Wharf Inn did us proud and we were soon quaffing Brakespear Ale and tucking into sandwiches. Excellent and really needed with the energy sapping heat.

After lunch we walked in the sunshine with a welcome breeze, down the road towards Fenny Compton and branched right on a footpath before passing under two busy working railways, over fields to reach the village. We turned left at the T junction, and walked on the road up to the pretty, old, stone, church and out on a field path behind the church up to another recently harvested wheat field and up a steep hill to reach Mill House standing proudly at 157 metres above sea level. We were now all feeling rather weary but it was still a couple of miles to go before we could get back.

There are great views from here over the Burton Dasset Hills and we stopped to take all

this in before setting off again over endless awkward stiles and dropping, thankfully, downhill to reach the busy A423 where we once again got on the canal for a nice level romp back to the pub and home for a cuppa. This is a fantastic walk in a super scenic area packed with history and great practice for the gentle hills in Dorset in a couple of weeks.

Our walks are normally on the third Saturday each month so come and join us. We normally meet at 10 oclock at the village hall unless we are travelling further afield. The next walks are as follows:
